- In 2001 the remains of a garden thought to have been constructed by the 1791-1793 expedition of French explorers and scientists was discovered at Recherche Bay in south west Tasmania.
- Bruny d'Entrecasteaux, commander of the expedition and botanist Jacques de Labillardiére are two of the names we immediately recognise.
- This book came out of a 2007 symposium which explored the historical, scientific and cultural significance of the place.
- Includes an interesting and 'joyous' encounter between the French and the Indigenous people of the region.
- An example of the breadth of the book is Chapter 6 'Tasmanian Aborigines and the origins of language' and
- Chapter 7 'The technology of whaling: What they did and how'.
