For those with hearing aids there is a hearing loop at the ground level but not at the upper level.

Evacuation Procedure

If the EVACUATION alarm sounds, please stop what you are doing and calmly make your way to the nearest exit. For those located in the lower theatre the exit is straight out each doorway through the side foyers, for those of you located in the upper area of the theatre exits are located down the stairs and out through the side foyers. Please be aware of those around you that may require assistance and inform the Shine Dome staff if necessary. You should assemble in the car park next to the Shine Dome. Please do not leave the assembly area until you are instructed by a fire warden.

When moving from one end of a House building to the other, visitors are asked to use the appropriate walk path or use the covered terrace beside the fishpond in the quadrangle;


Smoking is not permitted within the building at any time;
