INTRODUCTION

The role of the Friends is to support the Australian National Botanic Gardens (ANBG) and to support the interests of the Friends and their activities aimed at the wider community.

The Strategic Plan of the Friends of the ANBG sets forth a Vision and Mission that provides the organisation with a clear path for the future. In addition, the plan identifies the core values that embody how the Friends, individually and collectively, will carry out the Friends' Mission. In the following pages, the Friends lay out the Goals, Objectives and Strategies to realise its Vision.

The Goals identify how the Friends intend to address its critical factors which support its Vision and Mission. The Goals are designed to drive actions. They address issues in a general sense by stating the overall policy intention that drives broad activity areas.

Each Goal includes a set of Objectives, supported by a list of major Strategies that will be used to achieve the Goals and its Objectives. Flowing on, the Key Priorities for each year provide further detail for an action plan that is set and evaluated by Council annually.
