

12. Still on your right is *Grevillea jephcottii*, or Green Grevillea, a rounded plant with small leaves and green flowers in clusters over a long period (photo below left). These plants are native to a few areas near the Burrowa-Pine Mountains region of northeastern Victoria.



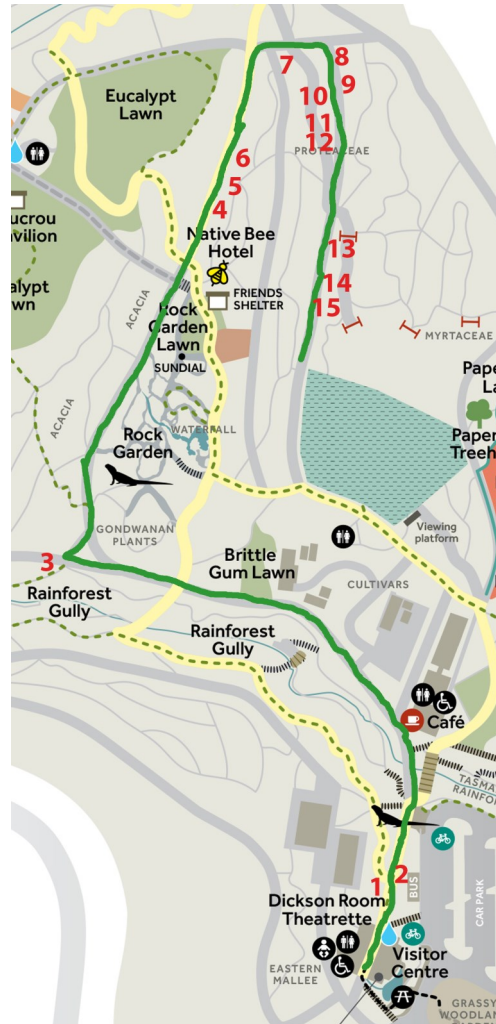
13. On your left is *Banksia integrifolia subsp. compar* or Coast Banksia, a small tree with long yellow flowers and dark-green leaves with silver backs (photo above right). This tree is native to the east coast of Queensland.

14. Also on your left is *Isopogon cuneatus*, an upright shrub with floppy branches of flat bright green leaves, often tinged with red, and large pink heads of drumstick flowers (photo below left). This plant is native to southwestern Western Australia.



15. Still on your left is *Banksia media*, or Southern Plains Banksia, with broad, toothed, leathery leaves and bright yellow flowers with brown tips (photo above right). This plant is native to the south coast of Western Australia.

Today we will walk up the hill behind the café, along the road above the Rock Garden, then back towards the café again



1. After you leave the Visitor Centre, on your left is *Epacris longiflora* 'Nectar Pink', a very floriferous small shrub covered in slender pink bells with white tips (photo above).

2. On your right is *Crowea* 'Little Rockstar', a compact form of *Crowea*, reaching only 60-80cm high, from a seedling variant growing at the ANBG (photo next page top left). This plant has many pink star flowers.



3. Bear left up the hill behind the café to see, on your left, as you turn right along the road above the Rock Garden, ***Banksia aquilonia***, an erect tree, with long green leaves and young tan flowers which fade to pale yellow with age (photo above right). This plant is native to northern coastal Queensland.



4. Further on your right is ***Hakea constablei***, a bushy shrub or small tree with very large brown nuts (photo above). This plant is endemic to the Blue Mountains near Sydney and was named after Ernest Constable, a plant collector for the Royal Botanic Gardens, Sydney.



5. Also on your right is ***Hakea archaeoides***, a shrub with oblong leaves and clusters of grey woody nuts (photo above). This plant is native to the north coast of New South Wales and is listed as vulnerable in the wild.

6. Still on your right is ***Hakea drupacea***, commonly known as Sweet Hakea, an open tree or shrub with green, sharp-pointed leaves and white pincushion flowers (photo below left). This plant is native to southwestern Western Australia.



7. Turn right downhill to see, on your right, ***Grevillea wilsonii x tripartita***, a tall, rangy bush with prickly foliage and large pink spider flowers with red styles (photo above right).



8. Turn right along the next road to see, on your left, ***Banksia spinulosa***, a bush with large pale- yellow flowers held upright on toothed, linear, grey-green foliage (photo above). Sometimes known as the Hairpin Banksia, this plant is native to the three eastern states extending along the coast from Victoria to Cairns.

9. Also on your left is ***Grevillea 'Sid Reynolds'*** which arose as a seedling in the garden of Sid Reynolds and is thought to be a hybrid between *G. pinaster* and *G. commutata* (photo below). This shrub has fine green foliage and red and yellow spider flowers.



10. On your right is ***Banksia neoanglica***, or New England Banksia, with silver-backed, dark green foliage with gold flowers held upright (photo below). This shrub is native to the eastern tablelands of Queensland and New South Wales.



11. Also on your right is ***Grevillea irrasa subsp. didymochiton***, a tall rangy bush with oblong, green foliage and red spider flowers, native to the Moruya and Pambula areas of southeastern NSW (photo below).
